In June 2019, on a sunny afternoon in Cape Coast, I took my daughters to a hotel pool. As we waited, I noticed five children sitting quietly nearby. When the pool opened, my girls jumped in with joy, yet those children stayed on the sidelines. Curious, I asked why. The eldest whispered: "We're waiting until evening. It will cost less then. We can't afford the full price."

Later, as I read a picture book to my baby, those same children gathered around, captivated by the colourful pages. Their eyes lit up, their laughter filled the air, and in that instant I saw both the beauty of their potential and the weight of their limitations.

As a mother, I couldn't stop wondering about their own mothers. Did they wish to be here too, but couldn't? Did they know where their children were? That moment stirred something in me, which is gratitude, empathy, and a deep responsibility to act.



So, I joined hands with like-minded people and asked: How can we give back? How can we open doors for children and the women raising them?

The answer became the foundation of our mission: to provide books, learning tools, and opportunities for children as well as skills training, and empowerment for women.

That single poolside encounter planted the seed for Golden Height Foundation, a movement built on empathy, hope, and action. Today, we stand to unlock the potential of children through education and to empower women with independence and dignity.

3. Excellence


We are committed to delivering high-quality programmes, ensuring measurable outcomes that inspire learning, leadership, and long-term transformation.

1. Educational Support for Pupils

Golden Height assist with addressing the resource gap in rural schools by providing:

Computer Labs & Libraries – Equipping schools with solar-powered computer labs, books, and digital content to build strong literacy and digital skills from an early age.

Upgraded Learning Spaces – Supporting the furnishing of classrooms and reading corners to create safe, engaging environments.

Learning Materials – Distributing backpacks, stationery, and age-appropriate teaching aids to ensure pupils are fully prepared for school.

Teacher Training – Providing computer and digital skills training for teachers to enhance learning delivery.

Through these interventions, we improve academic outcomes and nurture children's creativity, problem-solving, and competitiveness in today's digital world.

Soap-making, catering, beadwork, tailoring, and other trades suited to local and international markets.

Financial Literacy & Digital Tools
– Training women in savings, bookkeeping, mobile money, and digital marketing to strengthen financial independence.

Entrepreneurship & Cooperative Models – Supporting women-led micro-enterprises and cooperatives to build collective resilience and reinvest in their families.

These initiatives reduce household poverty, improve education for children (as women reinvest in their families), and foster women's leadership in rural communities.

4. Sustainable & Scalable Impact

Our model is built for long-term growth and resilience:

Starting with three school donations annually, ensuring depth and measurable impact.

Scaling gradually toward monthly outreach programmes as resources grow.

Leveraging solar energy savings and community ownership to reinvest in libraries, computer labs, and women's cooperatives.
